

Nicole Evelina is a USA Today bestselling author of historical fiction, non-fiction, and women's fiction whose books have won more than 50 awards, including four Book of the Year designations. Nicole now lives in South Bend, Indiana, and is now a hybrid author, but was named Missouri's Top Independent Author by *Library Journal* as the winner of the Missouri Indie Author Project in 2018. She has been awarded the North Street Book Prize and the Sarton Women's Book Award. One of her books, *Madame Presidentess*, was previously optioned for film.

She is also an accomplished speaker, having presented at international, national and regional writing conferences -- both on panels and teaching solo - to groups ranging from academics and writers to high school students, on a variety of topics including historical women, writing fiction and non-fiction, and the business of self-publishing.

Her fiction tells the stories of strong women from history and today, with a focus on biographical historical fiction, while her non-fiction focuses on women's history. Both share the stories of unknown or little-known figures.
