Nicole Evelina is a USA Today bestselling author of historical fiction, non-fiction, and women's fiction whose books have won more than 50 awards, including four Book of the Year designations. Nicole now lives in South Bend, Indiana, and is now a hybrid author, but was named Missouri's Top Independent Author by *Library Journal* as the winner of the Missouri Indie Author Project in 2018. She has been awarded the North Street Book Prize and the Sarton Women's Book Award. One of her books, Madame Presidentess, was previously optioned for film.

She is also an accomplished speaker, having presented at international, national and regional writing conferences -- both on panels and teaching solo - to groups ranging from academics and writers to high school students, on a variety of topics including historical women, writing fiction and non-fiction, and the business of self-publishing.
